

## MASTERS

There are 84 Saskatchewan Athletics/ Canadian Masters/Athletics Canada members.

There were 27 athletes from Saskatchewan who attended the 2019 Canadian Masters Athletics Indoor Championships in Edmonton March 8-10. They had five Meet Records (MR), five Saskatchewan (SR) and four Canadian records (CR) and returned with 20 Gold, 2 Silver and 2 Bronze medals. There were 42 clubs attending and 3 clubs from Saskatchewan ranked in the top 7 combined team scores.

Fifty-one Saskatchewan (includes sub-master athletes); two Canadian and one World record have been set or broken in the indoor season.

One athlete attended the 2019 Canadian Masters Athletics Outdoor Championships in Montreal, QC returning with 5 gold medals. There were 7 athletes from Saskatchewan who attended the 2019 NCCWMA Outdoor Championships in Toronto July 19-21. They had one Meet Record (MR), five Saskatchewan (SR), 4 Gold, 3 Silver and 8 Bronze medals.

Forty Saskatchewan (includes sub-master athletes) and one Canadian record have been set or broken in the outdoor season.

**Carol LaFayette-Boyd** was nominated by NCCWMA for Overall Best Female and Best Jumper. She was selected as 2018 World Masters Overall Best Female Award and 2018 World Masters Runner-Up Jumps. **Ted Rowan** was nominated for NCCWMA Best Male Master in Combined events. He was named WMA runner up in Combined Events. He was also named Sask Sport Masters Athlete of the year. CMA awards for 2018 went to Carol LaFayette-Boyd who received the Olga Kotelka award for Field events and Ted Rowan received the Ian Hume award for Combined Events.

The Bob Adams Awards of Excellence for Masters 2019 went to Mike Taylor and Andrea Kozan. Dave Olsen and Carol LaFayette-Boyd were recipients of the Howard West Award. Chad Kichula was recipient of a Coach Award.

The 2020 CMA Indoor championships will be held in St. John, New Brunswick March 14-15. The CMA Outdoor championships will be held in Regina, June 12-14, 2020. World Masters Athletics Outdoor Championships will be held in Toronto July 20 to August 1, 2020.
