Members of the Saskatchewan Athletics receive the following privileges:

- access to certified coaching and officiating
- the right to compete on Provincial and National Teams
- the right to compete in Provincial, National and International Championships
- the right to officiate in Provincial, National and International Competitions
- sport accident and liability insurance coverage
- the opportunity to receive travel grants
- the opportunity to receive athletic and academic funding support
- the ability to access and order equipment
- access to clinics and upgrading opportunities
- regular communication through newsletters and website
- ranking and record privileges

This record shows the various requirements to obtain a level. This will give you an idea of what “you” have to do in order to achieve the next level.

Note: At levels 3, 4 and 5 at least **40%** of your credits must be outdoors.

All credits must be in area seeking designation.

Provisional: Basic clinic

Level One: (Generalist)

- 6 credits in various disciplines
- 6 months service

Level Two: (Generalist)

- 6 months service/1 mentor session
- 12 credits in various disciplines (T&F)

Level Three: (Specialist)

- 1 yr service at Lvl 2
- Open Book Assignment
- Discipline Specific Clinic
- 16 credits (discipline specific)
- 8 credits as Ch/Asst.Ch/Sec.Head
- 2 mentor sessions while Ch/Asst.Ch/Sec.Head

Level Four: (National)

- 2 yrs service at Lvl 3
- National Clinic
- 24 credits (discipline specific)
- All credits as Ch/Asst.Ch/Sec.Head
- 8 credits after clinic date
- 8 credits at Nat &/or NC Classification
- 2 mentor sessions while Ch/Asst.Ch/Sec.Head

Level Five: (International)

- 3 yrs service at Lvl 4
- 36 credits (All as Chief)
- 8 credits at Nat/NC Classification
- 2 mentor sessions
